

The State of South Carolina,
By the Secretary of State.

Whereas, G. G. Capers, B. A. Morgan, B. J. Whitmore and H. D. Baeot did, on the eighth day of July, 1893, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth: First; the names and residences of the said petitioners to be G. G. Capers, B. A. Morgan, B. J. Whitmore and H. D. Baeot, all of whom reside in the City of Greenville, South Carolina.

Second; the name of the proposed Corporation to be that of "The Greenville Park Association" and Greenville, S. C., is the place it purposes to have its only place of business, the general purpose of the Corporation is to provide a park for holding athletic games and other sources of amusement, to the common benefit of the stockholders of said Corporation.

Third; the amount of Capital stock to be Six Hundred Dollars, and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be sixty of the par value of Ten Dollars each, And Whereas, on the eighth day of July, 1893, the said G. G. Capers, B. A. Morgan, B. J. Whitmore and H. D. Baeot were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators, authorizing and empowering them to open books of subscription to the Capital Stock of said proposed Corporation, giving not less than one days previous notice, by advertisement, in the ————, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, giving notice of the time and place where said books of subscription would be opened;

And Whereas, the said Board of Corporators, on the twentieth day of July A.D. 1893, did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing, over their signatures, certifying among other things: That fifty four shares have been subscribed and paid into the hands of the Treasurer.

Now, therefore, J. E. Duval, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by an Act of the General Assembly, entitled "An Act to Provide for the Incorporation of Certain Corporations under General Laws", approved the twenty-third day of December, 1886, and all Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that said Company has been fully organized, according to the Laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purpose indicated in the within Declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their Charter; and that a copy of this
