Whereas Berry League, late of the County
and State aforesaid, in or about the year 1883, purchased of me,
Doliver P. Smith, of said County and State, the tract of land
hereinafter described at the price of six hundred and fifty
dollars, and paid me said price in full, and thereupon
made to him a deed in fee simple for said land, which deed
was never recorded and is now lost, of which land the said
Berry League since his said purchase was in the full possession
and enjoyment, up to the time of his death. And whereas
the said Berry League departed this life on June 17th, 1893,
leaving of force his death will and testament, by which he gave
to his wife Sallie J. League all his household and kitchen
furniture absolutely, and all his other property, both real and
personal, he gave to her, for life, and the money that shall be
obtained from the sale of all his estate that remain at her death.
He gave to The Southern Baptist Convention Chartered by the
Legislature of the State of Georgia. By said will he appointed
his wife Sallie J. League executrix thereof; and said will
was admitted to probate in Common Form by the Probate
Court for said County on June 2nd, 1893, and on the same
day the said Sallie J. League duly qualified as executrix thereof
but died a few days afterwards without having administered said
estate. And whereas George H. Jones, after the death of said
Sallie J. League, was duly appointed administrator with
the will annexed of the said Berry League by the Probate
Court for said County. And whereas it is feared that
purchasers may be deterred from buying said land by
reason of the loss of the deed thereto as aforesaid; and I am
willing to perfect and confirm said title.

Now therefore in consideration of the premises and of the
sum of five dollars to me in hand paid by George H. Jones ad-
ministrator as aforesaid, I have bargained, sold, released, confirmed
and conveyed and by these presents do ~~do~~ bargain, sell, release,
confirm and convey unto the said George H. Jones, administrator,
(all that certain tract or parcel of land situate in the State of)
County and State on waters of Durbin Creek, containing
forty acres, more or less, bounded by lands now or formerly of
W. H. Hughes on the north, S. A. Howard on the East, John T. Howard
on the South, and J. S. Thomas's estate on the West, being
the land conveyed to me by Jasper Newland Howard on
November 2nd, 1880, the deed whereof is recorded in the
