To all whom these presents shall come:

I, Perry D. Gilmore, Sheriff of Greenville County, and State of said,  
 and Justice of Peace, by virtue of a certain writ of Fieri Facias,  
 issued out of the Court of Common Pleas, held for the County of  
 Greenville, dated the sixth day of August, in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and four, at the suit of  
 Thomas J. Sullivan as Executor of the last will and testament  
 of Francis A. Goodgins, deceased, against Joseph P. Latimer and John  
 W. Latimer, as Executors of the last will and testament of  
 Rowlett Sullivan, deceased, to me directed, commanding me,  
 that of the goods and chattels, lands and tenements of the  
 estate of Rowlett Sullivan, deceased, to levy the sum of five  
 hundred seven hundred and fifty seven and no dollars, damages  
 and costs, I have seized and taken of the lands and tenements  
 of the said estate of Rowlett Sullivan, to wit, a certain piece,  
 parcel and tract of land, containing two hundred and  
 eighty-eight (288) acres, more or less, situate and being in the  
 County of Greenville, in the State aforesaid, in Tricentennial  
 adjoining lands of G. B. Thomson, Washington Nash, John M.  
 Terry and others and known as the Terry place.

And whereas, the said Justice, with this appointment,  
 since the seizure by me made, by virtue of the said writ  
 of Fieri Facias before mentioned, I have been exposed to sale at  
 public vendue, and purchased by W. J. Haynesworth of the County  
 of Greenville, in the State of South Carolina, for the sum of  
 fifteen hundred dollars to being the highest sum that was  
 bid for thereof: Now, know ye, that I, Perry D. Gilmore, Sheriff  
 aforesaid, by virtue of said writ of Fieri Facias aforesaid, to me  
 directed and delivered as aforesaid, and by virtue of the Statute  
 in such case made and provided, and for and in consideration  
 of the said sum of fifteen hundred dollars to me in hand paid  
 by the said W. J. Haynesworth, the receipt and payment whereof  
 I do hereby acknowledge, have granted, assigned and sold, and by
