To all whom these presents shall come:-

I James L. Orr of the County and State aforesaid, as Receiver of Campersdown Cotton Mills, Greetings!

Whereas in an action pending in the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of South Carolina, in which O. H. Sampson and Company were plaintiffs, and Campersdown Cotton Mills were defendants, the Honorable Charles H. Timontou, one of the Judges of said Court, on the tenth day of September 1894, made a decree, in which amongst other things it was ordered that the said James L.
