The undersigned appraiser appointed to set off a hundred in real estate and an exemption in personal property to the petitioner out of the real and personal estate of the late Samuel Bruden respectfully make the following return after having first been duly sworn to him for that purpose and set off said hundred and exemption we went upon the premises, we found that Samuel B. Bruden died seized and possessed of a tract of land in the County & State aforesaid upon which he resided at the time of his death and upon which his widow the petitioner and her children have since resided containing 170 acres more or less and bounded by the lands of Mrs. Bruce, Joel Ballenger, J. M. Gibson, Henry Briggs & others and known as the Abney tract. We appraise the said tract at one thousand & one hundred & ninety dollars and set off to the petitioner Forat of Sumner as her hundred and exemption the following tracts and bounds of the real estate of the late Samuel B. Bruden viz Beginning at a black Gum & on the banks of the creek running thence N 62° W 4.75 to a pine oak 34 thence N 9° E 4.84 to a stone 34 thence N 81° W 2.70 to a stone 34 thence N 26 1/4 E 4.90 to a pine 34 thence S 81° E 2.08 to the center of a spring 34 thence N 16 1/2 E 3.05 to a maple 34 thence N 35 E 3.81 to a small black Gum 34 thence N 1 1/2 E 12.95 to a small wood 34 thence N 67 1/2 E 1.35 to the center of a spring 34 thence N 47° W 1.44 to a black Gum 34 thence N 1/2 E 11.25 to a stake 34 in the center of the millers Road (N. W.) thence N 39° W 5.93 to a stake 34 on the west side of said Road (N. W.) thence S 13 1/2° W 1 Chain to a stake 34 (N. W.) in the center of said road thence S 67 1/2° W 19.81 to a stone (N.
