And whereas, on the 19th day of April 1895, the said Alester G. Sumner and Chas M Rabb were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators authorizing and empowering them to open books of subscription to the Capital Stock of said proposed Corporation, giving not less than one day previous notice, by advertisement in a newspaper published in the County of Greenville giving notice of the time and place where said books of subscription would be opened,

And whereas, the said Board of Corporators on the 22nd day of May did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing, over their signatures certifying among other things: Six Thousand Dollars was subscribed and Three Thousand Dollars paid in and the Company has been duly organized according to law,

Now therefore, I, D. H. Pomplins Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by an act of the General Assembly, entitled "An Act to Provide for the Incorporation of Certain Corporations under General Laws," approved the twenty third day of December 1886, and all Acts amendatory thereto do hereby certify that said Company has been fully organized, according to the Laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purpose indicated in the within Declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their Charter, and that a copy of this Certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyances in each County where such Corporation shall have a business office,
