Davis, Trustees of the Wadsworthville Poor School of Laurens County, in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Seventy (\$70) Dollars to us in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these Presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold
