the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell, and release unto the said

all of that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, containing two hundred and fifty acres, more or less, it being the same tract of land devised to the said *Robert Thomason* by his wife *Lavinia Thomason*, by last will and testament, and the same tract deeded to her by *H. W. Smith, Corcher, Acting Sheriff*, on the *2nd* day of *January* 1891, by deed recorded in R. M. C. office, Book C. C. Page 434, the same tract of land being bounded by lands of *J. P. Reese, D. J. Collins, W. E. Drew* and others.
