 the following angles and bounds: beginning on a stone 30 rods from said St John's St, then running
 326.00 rods to a stone 30 rods from the corner running N 45° 34' W 53.66 rods to a stone 30 rods from the corner running N 52° 18' E 112
 rods to a stone 30 rods from St John's St, thence running S 80° 48' E 53.66 rods along with the said street to the
 beginning, containing six acres, grace and half more or less adjoining lots of Mr. J. Williams and
 Mr. J. Williams and others, and in the same lot, that was by R. J. Williams surveyed in December 1871
 by deed bearing date December 10, 1871, which is duly recorded in the office in Book 3, at page 592
