Holliday and also in the further consideration of the sum of Eight - \$67.00 Dollars, to the said William N. Holliday in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by the said William N. Holliday (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said William N. Holliday, all that piece parcel and tract of land situated lying and being in State and County aforesaid, and bounded by lands belonging to myself the said J. E. Holliday, to Gassette, R. M. Colley, James M. McFee, ex Marriage Thirtysix and one fourth acres, more or less, and known as tract No 12 in the division that I have this day made of my real estate. The boundaries beginning on stone near Big road, thence S 87 31 W 29 68 to stone, thence S 32 48 E 16 71 to stone, thence N 73 34 E 20 47 to stone, thence S 63 48 E 23 to stone, thence N 73 34 E 2 23 to stone, thence N 74 W 11 73 to stone the Beginning corner, By referring to plat hereunto annexed made by D. H. Boyce of equal date with these presents the boundaries will more fully appear.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said Premises before mentioned unto the said William N. Holliday his heirs as hereafter mentioned, Heirs and Assigns forever. I, James E. Holliday, do give and convey to my wife, Daisy Holliday, a right to run a road through the premises leading from No 10 in addition that I have made up to the said No 10 in the direction of the bridge, and I have committed to my wife during his natural life to enjoy all the rents, profits and income during his natural life, and at his death it may be divided equally, to be sold and the proceeds divide equally between his two children Marice May Holliday and Ida Estelle Holliday.

And I do hereby bind myself, my Heirs, Executors and Administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said William N. Holliday his

Heirs and Assigns, against me and my Heirs, and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
