Whereas B. S. Cox, J. B. Jones, E. L. Edwards, John J. McGee and Sam S. Knight did on the 18th day of May 1897 file with me a petition signed by them setting forth that they are residents of said County of Greenville and declaring that they and the other persons in said petition named are members of the Mountain Inn Baptist Church, and that they and the other persons in said petition named are desirous of being incorporated under the name of The Mountain Inn Baptist Church for the purpose of maintaining a Baptist Church in the Town of Mountain Inn, in said State and County, according to the Customs and usages of Missionary Baptist Churches in this State, and that said Church is located in said Town of Mountain Inn, and is to continue its location therein, and the prayer of said petition being that said Petitioners and their said associates be incorporated under the name of The Mountain Inn Baptist Church according to the laws of this State, and be vested with such powers as are conferred on Churches incorporated under said laws.

Now therefore I, W. D. Metts, Clerk of the Court in and for said County of Greenville, by virtue of the power conferred on me by law, do hereby certify and declare that said B. S. Cox, J. B. Jones, E. L. Edwards, John J. McGee, and Sam S. Knight and their associates in said petition named are hereby incorporated under the name of The Mountain Inn Baptist Church for the purpose of maintaining a Baptist Church in said Town of Mountain Inn, according to the Customs and usages of Missionary Baptist Churches in this State and said incorporation is vested with the following powers To wit: 1. To make by-laws not inconsistent with the laws of this State or the United States. 2. To have and use a common Seal, and the same to change at pleasure. 3. To sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded. 4.
