Whereas under the act of the Legislature of the State of South Carolina approved December 24th, 1890 the Trustees of the Wadsworth Poor School and their successors in office, are authorized and empowered to sell and convey in fee simple to any person who shall purchase, all or any portions of the lands left by the last Will and Testament of Thomas Wadsworth deceased, for the support of a poor school in Laurens County if in their judgment it will be best for the interest of said school.

And whereas it has been determined by said Trustees that it will be best for the interest of said school that the lands hereinafter described be sold and the proceeds being a portion of the said Will of the last Will and Testament of Thomas Wadsworth deceased be the

Laurens County.  
 Now therefore know all men by these presents that we P. J. Hopland, Jr. J. M. Trague, C. C. Davis, A. C. Perkins and G. B. Lewis of Laurens County S. C. Trustees of the Wadsworth Poor School of Laurens County in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred and seventy five (\$375) Dollars, to us in hand paid as of and before the sealing and delivery of these Credits, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained, sold, released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto J. M. Langley his heirs and assigns forever, all that parcel, piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Greenville County State aforesaid in the Charles Wadsworth tract of Wadsworth near Santee, that containing about 74 acres more or less and bounded by the following to-wit: Beginning on the S. E. corner of the State Road, thence S 43° W 26.60 to an ash 370, State line, thence S 53° E. 30.75 to a stone by a branch, thence N 45° E. 8.00 to a stone 320, thence S 81° E. 5.25 to a stone 320, thence S 50° E. 8.00 to a stone 320, thence N 9° E 11.50 to a P. O. 5x0 thence S 89° 3/4 W 8.50 to a stone 320, thence N 9° E 7.30 to a stone 320, thence N 89° W 2.90 to a stone 320, thence N 9° E 6.20 to a stone 320, thence N 89° W 8.75 to a P.
