National Cash Register Co., Dayton, Ohio:

Please ship to us at our place of business, Mansion House Main Street, as soon as possible, one of your No. 11 Retail-Adding Registers. Case to be E. Denominations of keys to be Standard. In consideration of the above we agree to pay you Forty dollars Dollars (\$40.00), in U.S. Gold Coin or its equivalent, being price of register f.o.b. Dayton, Ohio, viz., \$8.00 cash with order; \$8.00 upon delivery; balance Eight dollars monthly. This Register is to be used on the Back Counter--Business.

Upon delivery of machine, you to send notes for signature for monthly payments as per above terms.

No discount to be allowed on price of autographic or other registers the price of which is \$30 or less, or an any amount allowed on registers taken in trade.

On presentation, should there be any failure to pay such draft, or execute notes for deferred payments, it is agreed that the full amount of the purchase price shall at once become due and payable. Should there be any default in the payment of any note it is agreed that all the remaining notes shall at once become due and payable, anything in the notes to the contrary notwithstanding. In default of any payments, you or your agent may take possession of and remove said cash register without legal process; and in such case, all payments theretofore made by me under this order shall be deemed and considered as having been made for the use of said register during the time the same remained in my possession, and shall be retained and kept by said register company as such payment.

Should the register get out of order, from ordinary use, any time within two years from date of shipment, you to quickly repair the same, gratis, the undersigned paying transportation charges to and from your factory or nearest agency capable of making the necessary repairs; or, if repairs are desired made where the register is located, the undersigned to pay the traveling expense of repairman from and back to your factory or nearest agency capable of making the necessary repairs.

It is agreed that the title to the said cash register shall not pass until the purchase price or any judgment for the same is paid in full, and shall remain your property until that time. It is expressly agreed that this order shall not be countermanded.

This contract covers all agreements between the parties hereto.

CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION.

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA

By the Secretary of State.

Whereas, C.H. Croskeys John H. Honour John L. Hacker, all of Greenville, S.C. two or more of the officers or agents appointed to supervise or manage the affairs of Saint Andrews Mission a mission of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the Diocese of S.C. which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the 15th. day of July A.D., 1903 file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That the said organization holds, or desires to hold, property in common for a Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose, or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit, or gain to the members, otherwise than as above stated, or for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and that three days' notice in the Greenville Daily News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

AND WHEREAS, The said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

First. Their names and residences are as above given.

Second. The name of the proposed Corporation is Saint Andrews Mission

Third. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville,

S.C. Fourth. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is to erect a church building, and conduct religious services according to the Constitution and canons of the Protestant Episcopal Church, in the United States of America, and the Constitution and canons of the Diocese of South Carolina; to conduct schools for the education along religious or industrial lines, and for other charitable purposes.

Fifth. The names and residences of all Managers, Trustees, Directors or other officers are as follows:

Sixth. That they desired to be incorporated in perpetuity

Cantl, Secretary of State, by virtue of authority in me vested, do hereby declare the said organization to be a body politic and corporate, with all the rights, powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the limitations and liabilities conferred by an Act of the General Assembly of South Carolina entitled: "An Act to provide for the
