

## STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That

I, Floride L. Stone of the City of Greenville  
in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum  
of Twenty-two thousand three hundred Dollars  
to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents, by Stone Land Company, a cor-  
poration organized and doing business under the laws of South Carolina and in the State (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged),  
have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said  
Stone Land Company, all that piece, parcel and tract of land in Greenville County, State of  
South Carolina, situated partly within the incorporate limits of the City of Greenville, on  
both sides of north Main street, containing by estimation two hundred and fifty (250) acres,  
be the same more or less, being all that now remains of the tract set off to Europa A. Stono,  
deceased, in his share of the lands of G.W. Barie, deceased, and formerly known as Tract No. 1,  
or the Home Place. Said original tract contained 452 acres and had the following boundaries:  
as shown by an old plat in the possession of said Stone Land Company: Beginning at a point  
on the Rutherford road, or street, south of Stone Avenue, and on the line of the old Men-  
hall property, and running thence N. 3 1/2 W. 15.45 chains to a point in said road, near the  
right of way of the proposed (abandoned) Newrens railroad; thence in a north-easterly direction  
about 10 chains to a corner in line of lot No. 2; thence S. 45 E. 7.70 to a stake on Good-  
lett line; thence S. 49.20 chains crossing a branch to a corner (now the S. W. corner of Gar-  
neau land); thence S. 70 E. 20 chains to a stake (now Mark's S. E. corner); thence in a north-  
easterly direction 25 chains to a red oak 3XOM; thence N. 45 E. 25 chains crossing Richland  
creek to a red oak 3XOM (Donaldson's land); thence S. 45 E. 30.50 to a chestnut 3XOM; thence in  
a south-westerly direction about 50 chains crossing Richland creek to a small hickory 3XOM;  
thence W. 47.50 chains to a post oak 3XOM in line with what is now Townes street; thence N.  
11 E. 10 chains to a corner; thence W. 31.50 chains to the beginning corner. Bounded by lands  
of Cleveland Thompson, Ollins, Donaldson, Norwood, Mark, Gargaux, Bunt and others. A large  
number of lots have been sold off to various parties since the said old plat was made. It is  
my intention to convey by this deed all of said tract not sold, extending east from Ruther-  
ford street and lying on both sides of Stone Avenue and other street, and acrossing the new  
chick Springs road and Richland creek. This deed conveys all of the land to me by said Eu-  
ropa A. Stone, November 22d, 1849, recorded in office of Register of Deeds Conveyance for Gre-  
enville County, Book D, page 755 and 756, and I do hereby reserve for and during the  
hours, together with the use of the yard and garden as now fenced in, and the out building  
contained therein, free of all rent or charge whatsoever, I do further reserve for and dur-  
ing my natural life, the use free from rent of a tract of about twenty acres, which shall be

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in  
anywise incident or appertaining, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said  
Stone Land Company, its successors,  
heirs and assigns, forever.

And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and  
singular the said premises unto the said Stone Land Company, its successors,  
heirs and assigns, against me and my heirs, and against every other person and  
against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same  
or any part thereof.

G.H. Ridgeway all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the  
State of South Carolina and County of Greenville, in Dublin Township, on a branch of Morris  
Creek, waters of Ready River, containing one hundred and thirty-one and one-half (131 1/2)  
acres, more or less, having following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning at a Spanish oak  
3XOM, and running thence S. 27 1/2 E. 17.20 chains to stone 3XOM; thence S. 68 1/2 W. 42.33  
ch. to poplar 3XOM; thence S. 79 W. 25.15 ch. to stone 3XOM; (20 like from persimmon 3.30M)  
thence N. 2 1/2 E. 23.00 ch. to stone 3XOM; thence N. 70 1/2 E. 7.05 ch. to the beginning  
Spanish oak; bounded by lands now or formerly belonging to J. Kirby, B.P. West, A. Lumley,
