Know all men by these presents, That I, Allen Gunter of the County and State aforesaid for and in consideration of one hundred and twenty-five Dollars, to me paid by George Murry (P.C.) of the same place, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold and conveyed and do by these presents grant, bargain sell and convey unto the said George Murry (P.C.) his heirs and assigns, a certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County of Greenville & State aforesaid and beginning on a stake on the bank of the State Road near John Gonnella Mill site, running with the State Road across the stone Bridge, thence to a stake at Allen Gunter's fence, thence south to a chestnut Oak bush, thence south to a Red Oak, thence East to a Hickory on Calahans line, thence with Calahans line N. 34 E. to the beginning corner, containing Fifty acres more or less, Together with all and singular the rights, members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said George Murry (P.C.) his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend the premises aforesaid unto the said George Murry (P.C.) his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against every other person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
