WHFFFAS the above bounden B.M. McGee has this day agreed to sell to the said Bessie Edens the following described tract of land in Greenville Township, County and State aforesaid known as Freetown near Cox Bridge road about three miles from Greenville City, being composed of two tracts or lots containing about three acres each, one tract known as Sewell lot and the other as Henry White's lot, bounded by lands of Prof. Harris, Goodlett and others, on condition the said Bessie Edens shall and do truly pay the amount of Five Mundred and Twenty Three (\$523.40) and 40/100 Dollars in the manner and at the times hereafter described, that is to say One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars upon the delivery of this agreement, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and the balance in five equal payments as will be shown by Five promissory not es of even date herewith, in the sum of Eighty Four (\$84.68) and 68/100 Dollars each, with interest from date at the rate of 8 per cent.per annum, all interest not paid when due to be computed annually and to bear interest at same rate as principal until paid in full, the said five notes being due as follows: January 9th. 1905, 1906, 1907, 1908, and 1909, respectively.
