KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That J. S. Boleman  
 of Greenville County,  
 in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Five Thousand  
Dollars, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by  
J. R. Peders of said State and County  
 (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. R. Peders two certain lots or parcels of land described as follows:

#1, a lot of land situate in Travelers Rest in the County of Greenville, State aforesaid on Quincouker street and known as lot #2, and has the following metes and bounds: Beginning at corner of lot #1, and running thence S. 11° 20' 50" feet to northern corner of lot #3; thence S. 79° E. 177 feet to a stone; thence N. 11° E. 50' feet to a stone being south east corner of lot #1; thence up said line N. 79° W. to the beginning corner being the same lot of land conveyed to me by R. W. Anderson by his deed bearing date 2, day of May, A.D. 1891 and recorded in the office of Register of Deeds Conveyance for Greenville County Book L page 701; lot #2 all that certain parcel of land in the town of Travelers Rest in the County and State aforesaid on each side of Quincouker street or road and South of Texas street, being all of lot #1, and a part of lot #2, and said lot and part of lot taken together have the following metes and bounds: Beginning at a stake, at the intersection of Texas and Quincouker streets and returning; thence S. 11° 20' 44" feet with said Quincouker street or road to stake; thence N. 86° 44' E. 18 1/2 feet to the intersection of line which divides lots #1 & 2; thence with said line S. 79° E. 109 1/2 feet to a stone; thence N. 11° E. 50' feet to a stake on Texas street; thence with said street N. 79° W. 177 feet to the beginning being the same lot of land conveyed to me by the joint deed of R. W. Anderson and Fayre E. Doodlett dated 27, Nov., 1891 and recorded in Register of Deeds Conveyance Office Book L page 220.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said J. R. Peders, his

Heirs and Assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind myself and my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said J. R. Peders and

Heirs and Assigns, against myself and my person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.


