Personally appeared before me D.T. Smith, who, being first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

I am now the Clerk of the First Baptist Church of the City of Greenville, in said County and State and have occupied that position for about forty years.

On June 18, 1899, the said Church, at its regular conference (a quorum being present) appointed a committee to consider the question of selling that lot situate on the North side of West McBee Avenue, in said City, County and State, used as a parsonage, with power to act.

I kept the minutes of such conference as Clerk the following record of the action of such conference was entered by me in the minute book under date of June 18, 1899, to wit:

" The following committee was appointed to consider the question of disposing of the present parsonage property and investing the proceeds in property more desirably located and better situated to the purpose; the committee being given the power to act, W. Goldsmith, Jr. J.C. Smith, J.A. Hoyt, J.B. Earle and A.A. Bristow".

On October 14, 1900 at the regular conference of the said Church, the committee was enlarged by the addition of two more members, and the disposition of the matter was left to this enlarged committee, as appears by my entry of that date in said minute-book, the additional members so appointed being T.Q. Donaldson and H.P. McGee.

On December 8, 1901 at a regular conference of said Church, the Committee made a report as appears by my entry in said minute-book under said date reading as follows:

"The Committee on parsonage reported the likelihood of a sale of a portion of the lot, and requested that the Church authorize some officer thereof to sign this and any other deeds in case of a sale of property.

On motion, the treasurer and Clerk were authorized and instructed to sign all deeds on behalf of the Church.

On the following day the committee, acting under the powers so entrusted to it, effected a sale of a portion of the parsonage lot, being the lot on the North side of West McBee Avenue above referred to, and the clerk and the treasurer signed the deed conveying the same to the purchaser, Mr. L.K. Kelly.
