Articles of agreement entered into this 15th, day of December, 1910, by and between T.P. Cothran, party of the first part, and W.M. Knight, party of the second part.

T.P. Cothran, has contracted and agreed to sell to W.M. Knight all that certain piece or parcel of land situated about four miles from Fountain Inn in Greenville County, part of the Phillips Place, containing 81.57 acres, more or less, fronting on Scuffletown Road, and having such metes and bounds as are shown upon plat of J.A. Adams, Surveyor, dated December 12, 1910, at and for the price of \$3,346.50 payable in ten equal annual instalments beginning December 1, 1911, with interest upon the whole at 8 per cent per annum, payable annually until paid in full.
