in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by

N.A. Howard and M.M. Burdine of the County of Greenville in South Carolina

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said N.A. Howard and M.M. Burdine all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and

being in the County of Greenville in said State of South Carolina on the Easley Bridge Road near the Corporate limits of the City of Greenville, being known as Lot # 9, of a sub-division of a certain tract of land containing thirty acres conveyed by J.M. Lengwik to Henry K. Townes by deed bearing date April 26th., 1905 and certain interest therein subsequently conveyed to the remaining Grantors, said deed to Henry K. Townes being recorded in deed book O.O.O. at page 192 in the R.M.C. office at Greenville S.C. having the following metes and bounds, courses and distances, to wit; Beginning at corner of Lot # 8, and Easley Bridge Road; thence S. 32 3/4 W. 70 ft. along said road, corner of Lot # 10; thence S. 43 1/2 E 190 ft. to corner of Lot # 10; thence N. 49 E. 70 ft. to corner of Lot # 8; thence along line of Lot # 8 N. 43 1/2 W. 190 ft. to the beginning corner containing 13,000 square feet, more or less; said corners on the Easley Bridge Road are about six feet from old road, which allows six or more feet for a side walk in front of said lot and along the said road, said lot herein described is represented on a certain plat made by W.A. Hudson, D.S. on June 20th., 1905, this deed conveys full and absolute title in fee simple to the said lot or parcel of land, known and represented as Lot # 9, on said plat.

Heirs and Assigns, against ourselves and our Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
