the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release, unto the said James F. Mackey, his heirs and assigns, All that piece, parcel or tract of land,

situate lying and being in the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, known as lot No. 1 of the property of the estate of John K. Earle bounded by Pendleton, new out Street known as Sumner, and garlington Streets, sold by the Master for Greenville, on Salesday in May, 1906 having the following metes and bounds, to wit; Beginning at the N.W. corner of Ella W. Hard's (formerly B.F. Blassengame's) lot on Pendleton Street and running with said Pendleton Street N. 71 W. 115 feet to a stake; thence at right angles S. 18 W. 220 feet to a stake; thence S. 71 E. 115 feet to line of said Ella W.
