the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Annie B. Walker, all that tract of land on the branch waters of Laurel Creek, three

miles East of Greenville City:

Beginning at a rock on William Goldsmith's corner; thence N. 19-1/3 E. 3.50 ch. to a rock on the North side of what is called Pyke Road; thence along the said Pyke Road 11 ch. to a rock; thence S. 12-1/2 W. 22.75 ch to a rock in the old field; thence N. 77-1/2 W. 10.90 ch. to a stake in William Goldsmith line; thence N. 12-1/2 E. 17.20 ch. to the beginning corner, containing twenty-five (25) acres, more or less, being the same conveyed by Harriet Wasson on February 8, 1883 recorded in R.M.C. office Vol. N.N. 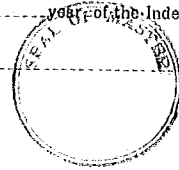
To HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said Annie B. Walker, her
