

Sinking Fund of S.C. Deed to James R. Cooper.

The State of South Carolina,
TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME--- GREETING:
KNOW YE, That in pursuance to the Acts of the General Assembly in relation to Vacant Lands,
For and in consideration of the sum of Ten 00/100 Dollars, paid to the Secretary of State by
James R. Cooper of Travelers Rest, Greenville County, S.C. the actual purchaser for value,
WE HAVE GRANTED and by these presents do grant unto the said James R. Cooper, his heirs and
assigns, a Plantation or tract of Vacant Land, situate in Greenville County, near Travelers
Rest in the State of South Carolina, containing One 15/100 acres, more or less,
on a small branch of Enoree River., having such, shape, form and marks as are represented by a
plat of said land on file in the office of Secretary of State in Book 2, of Public Land Plats,
page 44, together with all woods, trees, water courses, profits, commodities, appurtenances,
and hereditaments whatsoever thereunto belonging;
to have and to hold the said Tract of one 15/100 acres of land, and all and singular other
the premises hereby granted unto the said James R. Cooper, his heirs and assigns, forever, in
fee and common socage.
