Decree of the Court of Commissioners of Land Office for the District of Columbia, dated the 29th day of December 1845. I have administered and laid out unto John Porter, Clerk

a tract of seven hundred and nine acres of land situate in said District on both sides of the Gap Creek Road and on the North side of the Middle fork of Sabuda River, and including a small quantity on the South of said River, bounded by lines running S. E. and N. E. by Clackland's land N. E. by Cummings' N. W. and N. E. by Coopers Land N. W. by Crowder's land West S. W. and N. W. by Clackland's land and the River S. E. and N. E. by McQuibben's Land, including a part of three grants originally granted to George Wolf, and the whole of a grant of 142 acres originally granted to Joseph Schumel and now conveyed for the purpose of obtaining a new grant for the whole, including also two hundred and two acres bought of the estate of Henry Walburn the whole running such fence and marks buttons and boundaries as the above plat represents. Surveyed July 13. 1846
