situate in the County and State aforesaid, having the following metes and bounds; Beginning at a stone in the boundary line between Hutchings and the Pelham Mill lands, said stone standing about fifty feet from the water's edge of Enoree River and runs thence down stream along the following corners: S. 11-42 W. 178 feet; S. 9-44 W. 241 feet; S. 33-07 E. 188 feet; N. 54-58 E. 124 feet N. 9-23 E. 151 ft.; N. 5-51 E. 251 feet; N. 81-30 E. 130 feet to pine; S. 2-30 E. 142 feet; S. 2-15 W. 175 feet; S. 18-20 E. 144 feet; S. 65-12 E. 404 feet to iron pin; thence with Pelham Mill, leaving the river N. 31 E. 129 8 feet to a point in the boundary line between the Pelham Mill and T.
