NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, the said Mance Jackson in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof according to the terms of the said note and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to me in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said H. H. Towner, Attorney

all that piece, parcel, tract or lot of land situated in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,

Beginning on the north side of the Cox Bridge Road adjoining lands of Dan Still, Hayneworth, Wade Floyd Beginning at an iron pin corner of Dan Still's land run N. 15 1/2 W. 120, thence S. 75 1/2 W. 800 to a maple tree; thence S. 74 E. 850 to an iron pin; thence S. 50 1/2 E. 520; thence N. 74 E. 600 to the beginning, containing ten acres, more or less.

Also, all those two certain pieces, parcels or lots of land situate lying and being in the State of South Carolina and County and township of Greenville, on the south side of the Southern Railway, two and one-half miles from Greenville County Court House, in a section known as Freetown, near the Brandon Mills, and having such metes and bounds, according to a survey and plat thereof made by Rogers, Surveyor, dated October 6th 1910 and recorded in the R.
