Jesse T. Bell, his heirs and assigns:  
All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate lying and being in the County of Greenville, of the State of South Carolina, and being in Greenville Township, near Saluda River, and being a portion of the Harris River Farm, and being the same tract of land conveyed to mortgagor by H. H. Towns, of Greenville, S. C., by deed bearing date Dec. 13th, 1921, which deed is of record in office of Register of Mesne Conveyance at Greenville, S.C. in Deed Book 74, page 452, no reference to same will more fully show.
