I, Janie Goldsmith Little of said County and state,

WHEREAS, I, the mortgagor hereinabove named

in and by my certain Promissory note in writing, of even date with these presents am well and truly indebted to the mortgagee hereinafter named Mrs. Andrea C. Patterson, Trustee

Twenty-five Hundred Dollars, in the full and just sum of to be paid. On the fifteenth day of November, A.D. 1924 with the privilege of paying the same on December 15th 1922 or November 15th 1923. On failing to do so, at any time before the day of notice in writing of such payment, I, the mortgagor, shall pay to the trustee in writing of such payment, the sum of \$2500.00, plus interest from the date of this note at the rate of eight per cent. per annum, to be computed and paid quarterly until paid in full, all interest not paid when due to bear interest at same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest is at any time past due unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of ten per cent of indebtedness thereon besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind or if any part of the money due on said note be not paid when due (all of which is secured under this mortgage), as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said mortgagor,

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the mortgagee hereinabove named according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me the said mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the said mortgagee.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

Andrea C. Patterson, Trustee and her successors and assigns forever: All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being in the state of South Carolina and County of Greenville, in Fairview Township about one mile south of Simpsonville having the following metes and bounds according to a plat made by W. J. Riddle in 1921 from a survey made by W. A. Adams in 1915 and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a stone on the Neely Ferry or Fairview Road and running thence along said road N. 7° E. 17.85 chs. to a stone on said road; thence along said road N. 15° 30' W. 28.60 chs. to a stone on said road near my residence; thence N. 88° 2' W. 5.50 chs. to a stone; thence N. 52° 2' W. 19.15 chs. to a stone; thence S. 39° 2' W. 14.10 chs. to a Maple on Wildcat branch; thence S. 13° 40' E. 32.50 chs. to a stone; thence S. 88° 45' E. 23.34 chs. to the beginning corner, containing one hundred acres, more or less, bounded on the North and Northwest by other lands belonging to myself, on the east (beyond the Neely Ferry Road) by lands of J. M. Richardson, on the south by land of Huff and on the west by land of Davenport.

The tract hereinabove described by courses and distances includes the land which was conveyed by Thomas D. Goldsmith to B. C. Thompson by deed bearing date June 1, 1891, and lost without having been recorded. It was subsequently conveyed by D. P. Verner, Master, to Mary O. Goldsmith by deed bearing date January 7, 1895 and recorded in the office of the Registers of Deeds Bonneyances for said County and state in deed Book 14, page 209; it was devised to my sister Louise G. Burdette and myself by my mother the said Mary O. Goldsmith by her last will and testament bearing date October 4, 1914, and duly admitted to Probate by the Probate Court for said county and state and now on file in the office of said court in Apartment 129, File 9. The said Louise G. Burdette conveyed to me, her undivided one-half interest in 277 1/2 acres (including the 100 acres first above described) by her deed bearing date January 26, 1915, and recorded in the office first above mentioned in Deed Book 36, page 20. There is no other lien or encumbrance on said land or any part thereof by mortgage, judgment or otherwise, except a mortgage for Twenty-five Hundred dollars executed and delivered by me this day to Mrs. Margaret M. Strader. That mortgage and these presents are to rank equally in all respects, both are to be first mortgages and in case of foreclosure both are to be paid out of the proceeds of sale of said lands in proportion to the amounts due thereon, respectively, without priority or discrimination.
