(In these) two tracts of land being situated about one mile from the city of Greenville, in Greenville County, South Carolina, and set off aforesaid, having the following metes and bounds, according to two plats made by James T. Willis April 30th 1902.

Tract no. 1 Beginning at stone and iron pine on Augusta Road and running thence S. 44° E. 8' 00 to stone, thence S. 45° E. 11' 60 to stone, thence N. 41° E. 7' 75 to stone on Augusta Road, thence along said road S. 41° E. 2' 77, thence N. 41° E. 14' 40, thence S. 44° E. 16' 50 to stone on S. G. Vance line; thence S. 56° E. 4' 60, thence N. 37° W. 27' 88 to white oak southeastern corner of tract no. 2 hereinafter described; thence along line of tract no. 2 S. 62° E. 11' 10 to spring corner; thence S. 54° W. 10' 20, thence N. 41° W. 1' 50, thence S. 50° W. 14' 10 to stone and iron pine in Augusta road; thence with said road N. 41° W. 3' 00 to the beginning corner containing 51.1 acres more or less, bounded by W. J. Haines, J. G. Gason, S. G. Vance, Ira W. Davenport and tract no. 2, being the same lot of land conveyed to me by Thos. C. Huff by deed recorded in R. M. C. Office in Greenville Vol. 17 page 558.

Tract no. 2 Beginning at an iron pine in center of Augusta Road, running thence along said road S. 41° E. 10' 00 to iron pine on said Road corner of tract no. 1 thence with line of tract no. 1 N. 50° E. 4' 10, thence S. 41° E. 1' 50, thence S. 45° E. 6' 20 to spring; thence N. 62° E. 11' 10 to white oak northeast corner of tract no. 1, thence N. 37° W. 12' 12, thence S. 56° W. 25' 75 to the beginning corner, containing 1.9.9 acres, more or less, and being the same tract conveyed to me by Thos. C. Huff by deed recorded in Vol. 23, page 370.
