computed and paid.

until paid in full, all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note..... to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue
thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of *10%*.

.....besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to
the amount due on said note..... to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof,
be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note..... reference being
thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

bargain, sell and release unto the said *John D. Taylor*

All of the parcel or piece of land situated and lying
and being in State and County of aforesaid, having the
following streets and boundaries, beginning at an iron pin
thence in the middle of an old road along the said
road 97° degrees north, 40° degrees west thence along old
road to a corner in the middle of the road, the same
being the intersection of the old road and the New Bruce
road thence north 51° degrees, east 34° degrees thence along
center of the road to a bend N. 60° degrees, E. 244 degrees
along the center of the New Bruce Road 7 1/4 degrees north,
55 degrees east to an iron pin in the middle of the
road, thence 96 degrees to a stone thence along Dillingers
line 89° degrees north, 3.30' along the line to a stone
