About three miles from the city of Greenville, on the
 Spartanburg and Pelham Roads containing ten (10) acres, more
 or less, and is the old home tract of the late G. P.
 Evans and has the following lines and bounds, to-wit:
 Beginning at an iron pin on the Pelham Road and
 thence S. 89° E. 9.54 to stake on south side of Pelham
 Road, thence N. 73° E. 4.00 to iron pin, thence N. 71° W.
 13.91 to iron pin on old Spartanburg Road, thence S. 85°
 W. 7.60 to iron pin, thence S. 15° W. 6.65 to iron pin the
