THIS INDENTURE, made this 20th, day of December, A. D. 1920

by and between C.A. Henson

party of the first part, and the MECHANICS PERPETUAL BUILDING AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, of Greenville, S. C., a corporation, party of the second part,

WITNESSETH, Whereas, the said party of the first part is indebted to said MECHANICS PERPETUAL BUILDING AND LOAN ASSOCIATION in the sum of Twenty-eight hundred

Dollars, money loaned this day, with interest thereon from this date at the rate of eight per cent. per annum, payable weekly,

the payment whereof the said party of the first part is anxious to secure:

Now, therefore, in consideration of the premises, and in further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said party of the first part has granted, bargained, sold, and released unto the said party of the second part all that certain parcel and lot of land lying in Greenville County, in the State aforesaid, as follows, to-wit:

In Greenville Township, about two and a half miles west of the Greenville Court House, being a part of lot No. 1-3 of West Highland as shown on plat recorded in plat book C., page 257 and 259, and having the following courses and distances: Beginning at a stake on the East side of Georgia Avenue 85 feet south of the intersection of Georgia Avenue and Easley Bridge Road and running thence parallel with Easley Bridge Road N. 71 E. approximately 170 feet to right of way of P. & N. Railroad; thence with said right of way S. 9-10 E. 120 feet to stake, thence parallel with Easley Bridge Road S. 71 W. approximately 168 feet to a stake on Georgia Avenue; thence with Georgia Avenue N. 9-30 W. 120 feet to the beginning. Being the same conveyed to C.A. Henson by J.H. Wilbanks by deed dated April 8th, 1920, recorded in Book 53, page 53.
