TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY CONCERN: J. H. Smith, D. T. Foster, W. M. Compton
and J. L. Davis, Trustees of Methodist Protestant Church SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, we the said J. H. Smith, D. T. Foster, W. M. Compton
and J. L. Davis Trustees of Methodist Protestant Church
in and by our certain promissory note in writing of even date
with these presents am well and truly indebted to Easley Bank
in the full and just sum of Five Hundred Fifty and 61/100 (\$550.61) dollars
to be paid Twentytwo and 96/100 (\$22.96) dollars on the 24th day of April
1936 and Twentytwo and 96/100 (\$22.96) dollars on the 24th day of each
and every month thereafter until the 24th day of March, 1958 at which
time the entire balance of principal then unpaid shall become due
and payable said note and the within mortgage being given under
the provisions of title, of the Federal Housing Act, with interest thereon
from maturity at the rate of 7 per cent per annum to be computed and
paid annually until paid in full all interest not paid when due
to bear interest at same rate as principal and if any portion of principal
or interest be at any time past due and unpaid then the whole
amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at
the option of the holder thereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose
this mortgage. said note further providing for an attorney's fee
of ten per cent besides all costs and expenses of collection to be
added to the amount due on said note and to be collectible as
a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney
for collection or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected
by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is
secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference

reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That we the said J. H. Smith, D. T. Foster, W. M. Compton and
J. L. Davis, Trustees of Methodist Protestant Church, in
consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said

according to the terms
of the said note and also in consideration of

the further sum of Three Dollars to us the said J. H. Smith, D. T. Foster, W. M. Compton
and J. L. Davis Trustees of Methodist Protestant Church
in hand well and truly paid by the said Easley Bank

at and before the sealing and delivery of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by

these Presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said Easley Bank, its successors or assigns:

"All that tract or lot of land in the state of South Carolina,
in the County of Greenville, in Greenville Township, in the
City of Greenville, lying on the west side of Loyd Street and
Fortyfive (45) feet north of John Street, said lot having a
frontage of Thirtysix (36) feet on Loyd Street and running
in parallel lines parallel with John Street approximately
One Hundred Six (106) feet to the lot now or formerly owned
by Henderson, on which is situate a six room frame build-
ing known as No. 103 Loyd Street, and being a portion of
the lot of land conveyed by John Burdine to R. M. Pickens,
Henry H. Muell and Samuel Wyatt, Trustees for Methodist
Protestant Church, by deed dated May 19, 1879, and recorded
in Vol. 77, at Page 504, in the office of R. M. C. for Greenville,
County, South Carolina."

And if at any time any part of said debt, or interest thereon,
be past due and unpaid we hereby assign the rents and
profits of the above described premises to said mortgagor,
or its successors or assigns, and agree that any
Judge of the Circuit Court of said State may, at
chambers or otherwise, appoint a receiver, with authority
to take possession of said premises and collect said
rents and profits, applying the net proceeds thereof
(after paying costs of collection) upon said debt,
interest, costs or expenses, without liability to account
for anything more than the rents and the profits
actually collected.
