All those three lots or parcels of land in Greenville, S.  
C. to-wit:

I On head waters of Brush Creek in Saluda Township, said tract of land beginning on a black gum on a branch, thence running down said branch  $80\frac{1}{2}$  rods to a poplar near the bank of branch, thence up another branch 24 rods to a poplar on the bank of said branch, thence  $8.61 \text{ st. } 68$  rods to the beginning corner containing six acres, more or less.

II Near the North Carolina line in Saluda Township and beginning at a black gum on still house branch, thence running  $21$  west, 40 rods to a stake, thence  $E. 2 S. 30$  rods to a sourwood, thence  $E. 65 S. 19$  rods to the beginning corner and containing two acres, more or less. These two said tracts of land conveyed to Ella Pace by deeds dated and recorded as follows: St. B. Pace to Ella Pace, 9th November, 1916, recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. 41, page 584, and J. Henry Pace to Ella Pace 1<sup>st</sup> November, 1917, recorded in said office in Vol. 42, page 449.

III On the waters of Brush Creek off the North Ford of Saluda River and beginning on a black gum on still house branch, thence running  $N. 29 S. 76$  poles to a black gum on the bank of the road, thence  $N. 85 E. 20$  poles to a chestnut stake corner, thence  $N. 27 E. 54$  poles to a sourwood, thence  $N. 57 E. 20$  poles to a stake, thence  $S. 25 E. 99\frac{1}{2}$  poles to a stake, thence  $S. 61 S. 70$  poles to the beginning, and containing 36 acres, more or less, being the same property conveyed to Lula Milster by Virginia M. Remington by deed recorded in Vol. 130 at page 333 and by Lula Milster to Fred B. Green by deed recorded in Vol. 200 at page 231, being the same property conveyed to me by Lizzie Green, et al., by deed to be recorded herewith.
