to the holder of this note..... besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note....., to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note....., reference being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said W. G. Freshman

according to the terms of the said note....., and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me, the said J. J. Manning Lox

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said W. G. Freshman his heirs and assigns

all that certain tract of land situate in the County and State aforesaid and known and described as tract #1 of the lands of P. F. Cox as shown on plat made by W. A. Adams February 2, 1917 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County Plat Book 6, page 65 and having the following metes and bounds to wit. Beginning at an iron pipe in the center of the Fork Shoals Road and running thence with the center of said road S. 23 1/8 E. 3.65 chs to stake thence S. 82 1/2 E. 34 chs to stake thence N. 2 3/4 W. 7 chs to stone, thence N. 53 3/4 W. 27.98 chs to stone in the center of road thence with center of line of last mentioned road S. 54 1/2 W. 3.36 chs to an iron pin thence still with center of said road S. 53 1/2 W. 15.86 chs to the beginning corner containing 52.65 acres more or less and being a portion of the lands conveyed to J.
