NOW KNOW ALL MEN, That the said Mortgagor, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said Mortgagee, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to the said Mortgagor, in hand well and truly paid by the said Mortgagee, at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain and release unto the said Mortgagee, and his
 Heirs and Assigns, forever, all and singular that certain piece, parcel, lot or tract of land situate, lying and being in Fairview Township
 Greenville County, State aforesaid,

and are particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the northern margin of the C. & W. C. R. R. right-of-way, which point marks the south-eastern corner of the within described tract and is the corner with lands now or formerly owned by N. M. Pollard and W. D. Edwards; thence along said margin of said right-of-way S. 80 $\frac{3}{4}$ W. 15.07 chs. to stone in center of public road; thence along said public road S. 23 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 4.20 ch. to a stone, marking the intersection of said road with the intersection of a second road, thence along said second road N. 61 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 25.63 ch. to stone; thence leaving said road N. 42 $\frac{3}{4}$ E. 3.20 ch. to a point in said margin of C. & W. C. R.
