April 16, 1931, Fannie Marshall Swicegood transferred and assigned to this deponent a certain
note and mortgage given by Annie M. Moore to Amelia A. Metts in the sum of Twelve Hundred
Fifty (\$1250.00) Dollars, dated November 29, 1924, and recorded in the R. M. C. office for
Greenville County in Mortgage Book, Vol. 150, at page 98. That on May 21, 1934 this
deponent executed an assignment transferring all her right, title and interest in and to
said note and mortgage to Roy H. Bozeman as Receiver of the Bank of Commerce, which
assignment is recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Mortgage Book, Vol. 222
at page 392. At the time this deponent made said assignment to the said Roy H. Bozeman as
