computed and paid Annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof, who
may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of 10%

besides all costs and expenses of collection to be
added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any
part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which are secured under this mortgage; as in and by the said note, reference

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being in the State
of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Butler Township about two and a half miles
(2-1/2) East of the City of Greenville, between the Charleston and Western Railway and the
wagon road to Batesville, sometimes known as the Pike Road, containing fifteen acres,
more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at an iron
pin in the "Pike Road", near a pipe, and running thence with said road as a line S. 78
W. 6.26 chains to the bend in road; thence S. 81-1/2 W. 11.77 chains to center of C. & W.C.
R.R.; thence down said railroad as a line S. 52-1/2 E. 4.76 chains to curve in said railroad;
thence S. 46 E. 3.36 chains to curve; thence S. 37 E. 11.76 chains to iron pin in center
