

thence over the tract deeded by Sarah A. Hamilton and others to Joseph Lee, Sept. 11, 1912, and recorded in Book # 31, page 5-91, said Register's Office, and from James Jackson to Joseph Lee, Sept. 10, 1907, and recorded in Book # 24, page 3, said Register's Office, in a northerly direction, with said contour elevation line to near the mouth of Alston creek; thence leaving an island on the east side of Alston creek, and continuing in a south westerly direction with said contour elevation line until its intersection with said Alston creek; thence crossing said creek, and continuing with said contour elevation in a north easterly direction, then a westerly direction to the tract deeded by Albert Jackson to Joseph Lee, Sept. 10, 1907, and recorded in Book # 24, page 1, said Register's Office; thence continuing said contour elevation line 925 feet in a south westerly direction until it intersects the Hamilton Estate line; thence n. 62.16 W. 225 feet to stake; thence n. 46.16 W. 115 feet to stake corner; thence n. 87.40 W. about 195 feet to said contour elevation line 925 feet; thence with said line, in a northerly and westerly direction to the line of the Hamilton Estate; thence with said Hamilton line n. 2.00 W. about 405 feet crossing Green River to a hickory on the north bank of said river; thence n. 20.15 W. about 75 feet to contour elevation line 925 feet; thence continuing with the meanders of said contour elevation line in a northerly and easterly direction until it intersects with the line between the Albert Jackson place and the James Jackson place, near Batters creek, said tract being deeded by James Jackson to Joseph Lee, Sept. 10, 1907, and recorded in Book # 24, page 3, said Register's Office; thence continuing with said contour 925 over said James Jackson Tract up Batters creek, crossing said creek and continuing in a South easterly direction, crossing the line of Eli Jackson place, and continuing with said contour elevation 925 feet in an easterly direction, and leaving an island in bend of river to the C. H. Puppe Tract, said Eli Jackson place having been deeded by Eli Jackson to Joseph Lee August 22, 1907, and recorded in Book # 24, page 322, said Register's Office; thence continuing with said contour elevation
