

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA,

TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY CONCERN:

of Greenville, in the County of Greenville, and the State of South Carolina, send Greeting:

WHEREAS, Lucie Jones, the said Lucie Jones *in full, 1940*

in and by my certain note or obligation, bearing date the 13th day of May 1929

indebted unto The Carolina Loan and Trust Company of the City and County of Greenville, in said State, a body corporate, duly incorporated under the laws of such State, in the sum of nine hundred and fifty (\$950.00) Dollars,

with interest thereon at the rate of eight per centum per annum, payable monthly from the 31st day of May A. D. 1929

according to the provisions of the Charter, By-Laws, Rules and Regulations of the said Company in manner and form following, that is to say, that

I the said Lucie Jones shall pay or cause to be paid to the said Company, or its certain attorneys, successors or assigns, at Greenville City aforesaid, monthly, on the 20th or before the end of the month of June 1929, and on the 20th or before the end of each month thereafter for twenty successive months the sum of Fifteen and 1/8 (\$15.04) Dollars,

being the regular monthly installment payable on the nine hundred and fifty (\$950.00) Shares of Stock and Five and 5/8 (\$5.54) Dollars, being the monthly interest on the advance (or loan) until there have been paid twenty monthly payments, and shall for the next twenty months pay the sum of Thirteen and 7/8 (\$13.93) Dollars, (\$9.50) Dollars, being the regular monthly payment on said stock and Four and 1/2 (\$4.43) Dollars, being the monthly interest on balance due);

for the next twenty months the sum of Twelve and 1/2 (\$12.50) Dollars, (\$9.50) Dollars, being the regular monthly payment on said stock and Three and 3/8 (\$3.38) Dollars, being the monthly interest on balance due);

for the next twenty months pay the sum of Eleven and 1/8 (\$11.72) Dollars, (\$9.50) Dollars, being the monthly installment on said shares of stock and Two and 1/2 (\$2.22) Dollars, being the monthly interest on balance due);

for the next twenty months pay the sum of Ten and 1/2 (\$10.61) Dollars, (\$9.50) Dollars, being the monthly installment on said shares of stock and One and 1/2 (\$1.11) Dollars, being the monthly interest on balance due.)

Each of the above payments to be made on the 20th or before the last day of each month, and shall thereafter surrender to the Company the said 9-1/2 shares of stock and the certificate thereof, the amount at such time paid shares by me to be credited as a payment upon the advance of loan made to me the said Lucie Jones and shall pay or cause to be paid all fees which may be duly imposed upon, or charged against me the said Lucie Jones in accordance with the Charter, By-Laws, Rules and Regulations, as in and by the said note or obligation, and the condition thereunder written, reference being thereunto had will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN that Lucie Jones the said Lucie Jones in consideration of the said debt and sum of money as aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said The Carolina Loan and Trust Company, according to the terms of said note or obligation, and also in consideration of the further sum of Five Dollars to me the said Lucie Jones in hand well and truly paid by the said The Carolina Loan and Trust Company, at and before the sealing and delivery of these Presents, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said The Carolina Loan and Trust Company, all that tract or parcel of land, situated in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, and described as follows:

In Greenville Township, in the 6th Ward of the city of Greenville, fronting on Sullivan Street 41 1/2 feet with a depth of 140 feet (see plat made by J. N. Southern and recorded in Plat Book A at Page 478, and being more fully described in a deed dated April 1, 1921, and recorded in Book 5th, Page 156 R. M. C. Office for Greenville County from B. B. Breagale to Henry Jones."
