hereinafter spoken of as the Mortgagee, send greeting.

WITNESSES I, Robert R. Stokes, am

justly indebted to the South Carolina Security Company, a Corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of South Carolina, hereinafter spoken of as the Mortgagee, in the sum of

Three Thousand, Seven Hundred Fifty

(\$ 3,750.00) lawful money of the United States of America, secured to be paid by my heirs, executors and assigns, bearing even date herewith, conditioned for payment at the principal of the

South Carolina Security Company, in the City of Greenville, South Carolina, or at such other place either within or without the State of South Carolina as the owner of this obligation may from time to time designate, of the sum of

Three Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty

Dollars (\$ 3,750.00) payable as follows:

One Hundred fifteen (\$ 115.00) Dollars on the first day of September 1931, and a like amount semi-annually on the first days of every March and September thereafter, up to and including September 1, 1945, and the balance of the principal then remaining unpaid on March 1, 1946.

and is hereby assigned to Metropolitan Life Insurance Company of said County, Greenville, South Carolina, on October 22, 1930 in book 230, page 4, and said assignment is recorded in Metropolitan Life Insurance Company's records.

and also interest upon said principal sum to be computed from the day of the date hereof, at and after the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum.

payable semi-annually on the first days of every March and September from and after the date hereof until the said principal sum shall be fully paid, said principal and interest to be paid at the par of exchange and net to the obligee, it being thereby expressly agreed that the whole of the said principal sum shall become due after default in the payment of interest, taxes, assessments, water rate or insurance, as hereinafter provided. The obligee may call for gold coin of present standard of weight and fineness, in which case obligor shall make payment in same.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, that the said Mortgagee, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money mentioned in the condition of the said bond and for the better securing the payment of the said sum of money mentioned in the condition of the said bond, with the interest thereon, and also for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and paid by the said Mortgagee, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, conveyed and released and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, convey and release unto the said Mortgagee and to its successors, legal representatives and assigns forever that parcel, piece or lot of land with the buildings and improvements thereon, situate, lying and being

On the North side of Cothran Street in Greenville Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, being known and designated as Lot No. 19 on a plat of Wade Cothran property, plat of which is recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book H, at page 163, and having according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, courses and distances, to wit:-

Beginning at a point on the North side of Cothran Street, which point is 300 feet East of the Northeast corner of the intersection of McDaniel Avenue and Cothran Street, and running thence N. 9-35 E., 162.5 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 81-15 E. 65 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 9-35 W. 162.5 feet to an iron pin on the North side of Cothran Street; thence with the North side of said Street, N. 81-15 W. 65 feet to the point of beginning.

TOGETHER with the appurtenances and all the estate and rights of the said Mortgagee in and to said premises.

AND IT IS COVENANTED AND AGREED by and between the parties hereto that all gas and electric fixtures, radiators, heaters, engines and machinery, boilers, ranges, elevators and motors, bath-tubs, sinks, water-closets, basins, pipes, faucets and other plumbing and heating fixtures, mirrors, mantels, refrigerating plant and ice-boxes, cooking apparatus and appurtenances, and such other goods and chattels and personal property as are ever furnished by a landlord in letting or operating an unfurnished building, similar to the one herein described and referred to, which are or shall be attached to said building by nails, screws, bolts, pipe connections, masonry, or in any other manner, are and shall be deemed to be fixtures and an accession to the freehold and a part of the realty as between the parties hereto, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, and all persons claiming by, through or under them, and shall be deemed to be a portion of the security for the indebtedness herein mentioned and to be covered by this mortgage.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises and every part thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Mortgagee, its successors, legal representatives and assigns forever.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, that if the said Mortgagee, his heirs, executors, administrators, successors or assigns, shall pay unto the said Mortgagee, its successors or assigns, the said sum of money mentioned in the condition of the said bond or obligation, and the interest thereon, at the time and in the manner therein specified, then these presents and the estate hereby granted shall cease, determine and be void.

AND the said Mortgagee, its successors, legal representatives or assigns, shall also be at liberty, immediately after any such default, upon a complaint filed or any other proper legal proceeding being commenced for the foreclosure of this mortgage, to apply for, and the said Mortgagee shall be entitled as a matter of right, without consideration of the value of the mortgaged premises as security for the amounts due the Mortgagee, or of the solvency of any person or persons bonded for the payment of such amounts, to the appointment by any competent Court or Tribunal, without notice to any party, of a Receiver of the rents, issues and profits of the said premises with power to lease the said premises, or such part thereof as may not then be under lease, and with such other powers as may be deemed necessary, who, after deducting all proper charges and expenses attending the execution of the said trust as Receiver, shall apply the residue of the said rents and profits to the payment and satisfaction of the amount remaining secured hereby, or to any deficiency which may exist after applying the proceeds of the sale of the said premises to the payment of the amount due, including interest and the costs and a reasonable attorney's fee for the foreclosure and sale; and said rents and profits are hereby, in the event of any default or defaults in the payment of said principal and interest, or any tax, assessment, water rate, or insurance, pledged and assigned to the said Mortgagee, its successors or assigns, who shall have the right forthwith after any such default to enter upon and take possession of the said mortgaged premises and to let the said premises and receive the rents, issues and profits thereof, and apply the same, after payment of all necessary charges and expenses, on account of the amount hereby secured.

AND it is covenanted and agreed by and between the parties to these presents that the whole of said principal sum shall become due at the option of the said Mortgagee, its successors, legal representatives or assigns, after default in the payment of interest for thirty days or after default in the payment of any tax, assessment or water rate for sixty days after the same shall have become due and payable, or after default in the payment of any installment hereinbefore mentioned or immediately upon the actual or threatened demolition or removal of any building erected on said premises.
