Eleven Hundred and no/100 (\$100.00) Dollars,

payable to the order of the second party, together with interest from the date of said note on the principal sum remaining from time to time unpaid, at the rate of

five (5%) per centum per annum (or at the rate of interest fixed by Act of Congress),

the first payment on interest being due and payable on the 24th day of November 1934

and thereafter interest being due and payable

Twenty (20) annually; said principal sum being due and payable in

of Fifty Five and no/100 (\$55.00) Dollars,

each and a final installment of

and payable on the 24th day of November 1935

and thereafter the remaining installments of principal being due and payable

annually until the entire principal sum and interest are paid in full, and each installment of principal and interest bearing therefrom due date until paid at

the highest rate authorized to be charged under the Federal Farm Loan Act, as amended, all of which and such other terms, conditions, and agreements as are

contained in the said note, will more fully appear by reference thereto.

All that certain tract of land containing fifty-two and five-tenths (52.5) acres known as the Bryan Bright place, in Highland Township, of Greenville County, South Carolina, located on the Greer-Laudrum Highway, and also on the Jordan road seven miles north from Greer, on the waters of Beaverdam Creek, and now in the possession of C. Bryan Bright, bounded on the north by lands of Coleman Verdin; on the east by lands of J. A. Stokes; on the south by lands of William Forrester; and on the west by lands of Walker Hart. Said tract of land is particularly described according to a plat prepared by H. S. Brockman Surveyor, on the 14th day of October 1933 as follows to-wit:  
Beginning at an iron pin on the Greer-Laudrum Highway (also known as the Rutherford road) and running thence north 25 degrees East 7.80 chains to the intersection with the Jordan road; thence north 21 degrees East 5.28 chains to head in said road; thence north 31 degrees East 2.47 chains to pin in said road; thence South 47 degrees and 30 minutes East 5.00 chains to pin on Tyger School lot; thence North 32 degrees East 4.00 chains to iron pin; thence South 47 degrees and 30 minutes East 7.00 chains to iron pin; thence North 40 degrees East 12.50 chains to stone; thence South 48 degrees East 11.00 chains to stone; thence South 37 degrees West 26.45 chains to iron pin; thence South 85 degrees West 8.30 chains to stone; thence North 47 degrees and 20 minutes West 13.50 chains to the beginning corner.
