Twenty-eight (28) of the property of J. G. Jenkinson, deceased, on plat of

said property recorded in the office of P. M. C., for County and State

offoresaid in Plat Book of Page 207, which is hereby incorporated by

reference for a more particular description by metes and bounds.

Beginning at the corner of Lot 29, running thence S. 79-09 E. 70.3 ft.

to an iron pin, thence S. 23-09 W. 204 ft. to an iron pin; thence N. 67-48

20.50.7 ft. to an iron pin, thence N. 21-44 E. 197 ft. to the beginning.

Also, all that piece, parcel or lot of land, lying and

being in Paris Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,

containing 13.9 acres, more or less, on the east side of Davidson Road, and
