All that piece, parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid containing one and three fourths acres, more or less. Adjoining lands of William E. Langford, Mrs. E. M. Cleveland, being a part of the real estate of William Duckworth deceased, and having the following metes and bounds:
Beginning on Jones Gap Road 8 feet South of Langford Corner, leaving a space for road. Thence west parallel with Langford's line 140 yards to stake 3x; thence south 40 yards to stake 3x; thence east 140 yards to stake 3x to G. & K. Railway; thence north 40 yards to the beginning point.
