## MORTGAGE OF REAL ESTATE

and the lands upon which they are located or constructed, whether underground or overhead, or otherwise, and whether nowowned, erected or constructed, or hereafter owned, erected or constructed, together with any and all property of every nature and description used or acquired for use in connection therewith, including, without limitation of the generality of the foregoing, all service and connecting lines, poles, posts, cross-arms, wires, cables, conduits, mains, pipes, tubes, transformers, insulations, meters, electrical connections, lamps, fuses, junction boxes, wagons, carriages, trucks, automobile, tractors, horses, mules, fixtures, appliances, machinery, tools, equipment, furniture and supplies; the foregoing description to include, without limitation, the transmission or distribution lines or systems constructed, erected and owned by or proposed to be constructed or erected by or on behalf of the Mortgagor, and all right, title or interest of the Mortgagor in and to the lands upon which said electric lines are located or consturcted, pursuant to a certain Loan Contrattdated November 6, 1935, and as amended February 4, 1936, and with the funds advanced or to be advanced to the Mortgagor by the Mortgagee, in consideration of the Bond hereinabove referred to and secured hereby, a part of which said electric lines to constructed under said Loan Contract, are as indicated and shown by the solid black lines upon the map or plat hereto attached, marked Exhibit A, and made a part hereof, each electric line so drawn indicated and shown on said map or plat, being further identified by a capital letter or by capital letters and figures, and all of said lines being located in the State of South Carolina, within the respective counties of said state shown on said map or plat and hereinafter named, and described as follows, to wit:

- (1) The electric line shown on said map or plat, in the county of Oconee, designated A-1 thereon, beginning at the city, town or village of Westminister in said County, and extending along or upon State Highway No. 18, to the town or village of Oakway, in said county, a distance of approximately 7 3/4 miles, including all branch or lateral lines extending therefrom, or connected or connecting therewith.
- (2) The electric line shown on the map or plat in the county of Anderson, and designated beginning B thereon at Grays' Gin, approximately 7 miles west of the city of Anderson in said county, and extending along the various county roads in the McLees School Section. approximately 4.58 miles; together with all branch and lateral lines extending therefrom, or connected, or connecting therewith.
- (3) The electric line shown on the map or plat in the county of Anderson, and designated thereon, beginning at the town or village of Williamston in said county, and extending upon or along Cheddar Road and State Highway No. 20, to Cheddar Community in said county, a distance of approximately 2.45 miles, together with all branch and lateral lines extending therefrom, or connected or connecting therewith.
- (4) The electric line shown on said map or plat in the county of Spartanburg and designated B B thereon, beginning at a point at or near the town or village of Cherokee Springs in said county on Highway No. 221, at its point of intersection with a county road running north from said point, thence extending upon or along said county highway, a distanceor approximately 1/2 mile, thence extending therefrom upon or along said highway on a generally winding northwesterly direction, a distance of approximately 8/10 of a mile, together with any and all branches or lateral lines extending therefrom, or connected, or connecting therewith.
- (5) The electric line shown on said map or plat in the county of Spartanburg and designated C C thereon, beginning at a point on State Highway No. 221, a short distance north of the town or village of Cherokee Springs in said county and thence extending in a westerly direction upon or along the county road that leads to the town or village of Boling Springs in said county, for a distance of approximately 2.81 miles, together with all branch or lateral lines extending therefrom, or connected, or connecting therewith.
- designated 0 0 thereon, beginning at a point at or near Foster Chapel Church in said county, and extending along or upon Blackstock Road in a general southeasterly direction, a distance of approximately 9.7 miles; and beginning at a point on Blackstock Road, approximately 2.3 miles southeast of Foster Chapel Church, and thence extending from said point on Blackstock Road in a northerly direction along or upon the county highway that intersects Blackstock Road at said point a distance of approximately 1.8 miles; and beginning at a point on Blackstock Road approximately 1.5 miles; and beginning at a point on Blackstock Road approximately 1.5 miles; and beginning at a point on Blackstock Road approximately 1.5 miles southeast of Foster Chapel Church and thence extending in a westerly direction from said point or along a county road that connects with Blackstock Road at this point, a distance of approximately 1.4 miles; together with each and all other branches or lateral lines extending from or connected, or connecting with any of the electric lines in this paragraph (6) described. The lines in this paragraph (6) described, are in that part of the County of Spartanburg commonly known as Foster Chapel Church, Friendship Church, Stone Station and Walnut Grove communities.
- (7) The electric line shown on said map or plat in the county of Spartanburg and designated B thereon, beginning at a point on Highway No. 101, approximately 7 miles of the town of Greer in said county, and thence extending along said Highway No. 101, in the direction of said town of Greer, a distance of approximately 1 1/4 miles, thence extending therefrom in a
