with interest thereon from date at the rate of 7 per centum per annum to be computed and paid annually

interest at same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, and in case said note, after its maturity, should be placed in the hands of an attorney for suit or collection or if before its maturity it should be deemed by the holder thereof necessary for the protection of his interests to place and the holder should place the said note or this mortgage in the hands of an attorney for any legal proceedings, then and in either of said cases the mortgagor promises to pay all costs and expenses including 10 per cent. of the indebtedness as attorneys' fees, this to be added to the mortgage indebtedness, and to be secured under this mortgage as a part of said debt.

Flora J. White and her heirs and assigns:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being on the Chick Springs Road, about two miles North from Chick Springs, containing Two (2) acres, more or less, according to survey by H. S. Brockman, Surveyor, dated October 18, 1941, and having the following courses and distances, to wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the bank of the road, Northern corner of said lot, and running thence along the center of the road as a line S. 22.35 W. 280 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 53.40 E. 241 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 46.30 E. 306.3 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 58.99 W. 346.5 feet to the beginning corner.
