## THIRD

THE ADDITIONAL ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS AND MUNICIPAL FRANCHISES OF THE COMPANY, including towers, poles, wires, insulators, meters and other equipment, devices and appliances, forming a part of and used or useful in the construction, maintenance and operation of said distribution systems, or any of them, together with all rights-of-way, easements, permits, privileges, municipal or other franchises, licenses and consents for or relating to the construction, maintenance or operation of the distribution systems, or any of them, through, over, under or along any public streets, highways, avenues, alleys and public or private lands; including, but not limited to, the following described distribution system and franchises:

(168) All Company's right, title and interest in and to the Distribution System in the Town of Louisburg, North Carolina (but excluding the Distribution System owned by said town, which purchases power and energy from Company at wholesale for resale), together with that certain franchise owned by the Company and granted by the Town of Louisburg by ordinance passed on or about March 21, 1945.

(169) That certain franchise or consent owned by Company and granted by the City of Raleigh, North Carolina, by ordinance duly passed on or about June 15, 1944, and duly approved and ratified at a Special Municipal Election duly held on July 25, 1944.

And also all branches, extensions, improvements and developments of or appertaining to or connected with said distribution systems, or any of them, and all other distribution systems of the Company and parts thereof wherever situated whether connected or not connected with any of the foregoing systems, and whether now owned or hereafter acquired, as well as all of the Company's rights-of-way, easements, privileges, permits, municipal or other franchises, consents and rights for or relating to the construction, maintenance or operation thereof or any part thereof, through, over, under or upon any public streets or highways, or public or private lands.

## FOURTH

THE ADDITIONAL ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION LINES OF THE COMPANY (including but not limited to all transmission lines described in the Mortgage and which are now subject to the lien of the Mortgage in which changes in voltage or other changes have been made), including the towers, poles, wires, switch racks, insulators and other appliances and equipment and all other property, real, personal or mixed, forming a part thereof or appertaining thereto, together with all rights-of-way, easements, permits, privileges, licenses, consents and rights for or relating to the construction, maintenance or operation thereof, through, over, under or upon any public streets or highways or other lands, public or private; including, but not limited to, the following described transmission lines:

(98) The 132 KV wood pole, single circuit, transmission line extending from Company's Roxboro 132 KV substation, a distance of 47 miles, more or less, to a point near Raleigh where it intersects the Method-Durham steel tower line.

(99) The 110 KV wood pole, double and single circuit transmission line extending from Company's Selma 110 KV substation, a distance of 17.95 miles (1 mile double, 16.95 miles single) more or less, to its 110 KV switching station near Goldsboro.

(100) The 110 KV wood pole, single circuit, transmission line extending from Company's Goldsboro 110 KV switching structure, a distance of 27.74 miles, more or less, to its 110 KV steel tower line near Wilson.

(101) The 110 KV wood pole, single circuit, transmission line extending from Company's Goldsboro 110 KV switching station, a distance of 17.23 miles, more or less, to its interconnection point with Tide Water Power Company near La Grange.

(102) The 110 KV wood pole, single circuit, transmission line extending from Company's Goldsboro-La Grange 110 KV line, a distance of 1.08 miles, more or less, to its Goldsboro City 66 KV line.

(103) The 110 KV wood pole, single circuit, transmission line extending from Company's Duke 110 KV substation, a distance of 28.65 miles, more or less, to its Cape Fear Steam Electric Station.

(104) The 110 KV wood pole, single circuit, transmission line extending from Company's Laurinburg-Fayetteville line, a distance of 3.09 miles, more or less, to its Raeford 110 KV substation.
