in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Eunice J. Andrea, her heirs and assigns, forever:

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Paris Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, lying and being on the Duncan Chapel Road, being known and designated as a part of Tract #22 of the property of P. K. Thackston as shown on a plat recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book "K", Page 24, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a point on the Southern side of Duncan Chapel Road, at corner of Tract #17 and at the intersection of the G. & K.
