To All Whom These Presents May Concern

I, THEOBALD LEAPOLD TILMAN,

hereinafter spoken of as the Mortgagor send greeting.

Whereas I, Theobald Leapold Tilman

is justly indebted to C. Douglas Wilson & Co., a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of South Carolina, hereinafter spoken of as the Mortgagee, in the sum of Nine Thousand and No/100-----Dollars

(\$ 9,000.00), lawful money of the United States which shall be legal tender in payment of all debts and dues, public and private, at the time of payment, secured to be paid by that one certain bond or obligation, bearing even date herewith, conditioned for payment at the principal office of the said C. Douglas Wilson & Co., in the City of Greenville, S. C., or at such other place either within or without the State of South Carolina, as the owner of this obligation may from time to time designate, of the sum of

Nine Thousand and No/100-----Dollars (\$ 9,000.00)

with interest thereon from the date hereof at the rate of Four per centum per annum, ~~and~~

~~and~~ said interest

and principal sum to be paid in installments as follows: Beginning on the 1st day

of June 1950, and on the 1st day of each month thereafter the

sum of \$ 47.52 to be applied on the interest and principal of said note, said payments to continue

up to and including the 1st day of April, 1975, and the balance

of said principal sum to be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1975;

the aforesaid monthly payments of \$ 47.52 each are to be applied first to interest at the rate

of four per centum per annum on the principal sum of \$ 9,000.00 or so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid and the balance of each monthly payment shall be applied on account of principal. Said principal and interest to be paid at the par of exchange and net to the obligee, it being thereby expressly agreed that the whole of the said principal sum shall become due after default in the payment of interest, taxes, assessments, water rate or insurance, as hereinafter provided.

Now, Know All Men, that the said Mortgagor in consideration of the said debt and sum of money mentioned in the condition of the said bond and for the better securing the payment of the said sum of money mentioned in the condition of the said bond, with the interest thereon, and also for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar in hand paid by the said Mortgagee, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, conveyed and released and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, convey and release unto the said Mortgagee and to its successors, legal representatives and assigns forever, all that parcel piece or lot of land with the buildings and improvements thereon, situate, lying and being on the Southeast side of Rockwood Drive in that area recently annexed to the City of Greenville, in Greenville County, South Carolina, being shown as Lot 86 on Plat of Rockwood Park, made by Pickell & Pickell, Engineers, August 24, 1948, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book "S", at pages 168 and 169, said lot fronting 75 feet along the Southeast side of Rockwood Drive, and running back to a depth of 205.4 feet on the Northeast side, a depth of 208.7 feet on the Southwest side, and being 98.6 feet across the rear.

The mortgagor covenants that until this mortgage has been paid in full he will not execute or file for record any instrument which imposes a restriction upon the sale or occupancy of the mortgaged property on the basis of race, color or creed. This covenant shall be binding upon the mortgagor and his assigns and upon the violation thereof the mortgagee may, at its option, declare the unpaid balance of the mortgage immediately due and payable.
