"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Chick Springs Township, on Enorse River, near where the Southern Railroad crosses said river, adjoining now or formerly lands of James S. Cooper, Alfred Taylor, Mrs. Elmira Shockley, et al,

BEGINNING at a maple on the bank of said river, corner of Alfred Taylor land, and running thence N. 57 W. 12.55 chains to black cak; thence N. 44 W. 12.96 chains to P.O.; thence N. 30‡ E. 14.86 chains to iron pin; thence S. 22 W. 3.18 chains to stone 3xom; thence N. 16-3/4 E. 14.75 chains to birch on bank of river; thence down said river to beginning corner, containing 38½ acres, more or less.
